I understand that if my child is disruptive or consistently interferes with the learning of other students, I may be asked to withdraw my child from the class. However, the teacher and administrators will work with me and my child to resolve any problems so hopefully this will not happen.

I understand that my child is attending classes at Triune United Methodist Church at his or her own risk. I will not hold Denise Burgess, Veritas Classical Schools, or Triune United Methodist Church liable in any way.

I understand that Veritas Classical Schools - Nashville does not provide transcripts or award high school credit. As the homeschooling parent, I will award the credit to my child.

I will register with an umbrella school or the county before the start of the school year.

I agree to provide the books and supplies for my student before the first class period.

AVAILABILITY: Are you available to assist at the school a few times a year? We need a parent helper each class day to do the following tasks: supervise car line, briefly supervise classes when the teacher needs to leave the room for a few minutes, answer the door, make photocopies for teachers, provide first aid assistance to students, call parents to pick up a sick child, help teachers clean the lunchroom and bathrooms, and more. The parent helper's assistance allows the teachers to concentrate on teaching and ensures that students are properly supervised at all times. (Each parent helper will undergo a background check, paid for by Veritas Classical School.)

Veritas Classical Schools-Nashville Dress Code for 2022-23

Veritas Classical Schools has a standardized dress code. **The ultimate goal with our dress code is modesty and neatness.** Since the time spent in class is limited, we ask that dress code not become an issue. Please adhere to the requirements stated below.

SHIRTS

- **Any color solid or striped** classic polo shirt (long or short sleeve) may be worn.
- **Solid, striped or plaid** oxford shirts for boys and **traditional** oxford blouses or 100% cotton cloth blouses for girls are allowed.
- If girls wear a top underneath the polo or blouse, the polo or blouse needs to be buttoned, so that the girls are modest in their appearance. **NO** see through blouses.
- Shirts may not be worn like a jacket but must be buttoned up.
- Flannel may be worn but must not be old and faded.

PANTS/CAPRIS, SKORTS, SKIRTS, DRESSES, SHORTS:

- modest, traditional pants, knee length shorts or capris (solid color navy, khaki, black, gray, green, white or brown **ONLY**) **Jeans of any color are not acceptable for pants.**
- or a traditional knee-length or longer skirt, jumper, or knee-length skort (solid color navy, khaki, black, gray, green, white or brown **ONLY**) Skirts are to be traditional skirts, not layered skirts or slit skirts, etc.
- If younger girls wear skirts, it is recommended that they also wear shorts under the skirt.
- Skin tight pants or jeans are not acceptable for girls or guys. **Leggings or jeggings are not acceptable as pants. Solid leggings or jeggings may be worn under a knee length skirt.**

COATS, JACKETS, SWEATERS:

- Jacket or sweater worn over the polo or oxford shirt may be any color
 - You must have a polo shirt or oxford shirt under your jacket or sweater.
 - Sweat shirts must have a polo worn underneath them.
 - **No hats to be worn in class.**

SHOES AND ACCESSORIES:

- Shoe color and style is left to the parents' discretion.

PERSONAL APPEARANCE:

- No earrings for boys. Girls may wear earrings in their ears.
- No nose rings or other piercings
- No unusual hair color is acceptable. (Only natural colors)
- Boys' hair should not be long. It should be cut neatly.
- Students should arrive on campus clean and neat.
